

## TDF Set to Award Record Amount of Grants in 2025!

Included in the available grants for 2025 are exciting new increases, which include additional funding for:

- ▶ FEI riders
- Breeders and owners of U.S.-bred horses
- Youth/young adults
- Adult amateurs
- ▶ Judges
- ▶ Instructors/trainers
- Show managers
- ▶ Technical Delegates

The goal of our Impulsion Campaign is to strengthen TDF as an organization so we can continue to support growth of our grants and programs. TDF has been on an upward trend for many years, and we are thrilled that we are set to award a record amount of grants this year—TDF's Board of Directors has approved up to 150 grants totaling nearly \$500,000!

These grants represent potential funding to approximately 100 individuals and 50 equestrian organizations/dressage clubs, in addition to the Dream Program trip to Aachen and the popular Century Club program.

Beth Baumert, TDF's President and CEO said, "TDF has been striving for this \$500,000 milestone for some time, and thanks to our donors, it has been achieved! The next step is to award those funds. The TDF Board of Directors has authorized this amount, but we need worthy applicants. If you think you might be a worthy applicant, please apply, or if you know of a dressage person who could use help, please encourage them to apply."

## **TDF Grants Propel Trainer Education**

The positive impact of TDF's growth is being felt across the country. Last year, for the first time ever, two \$25,000 grants were awarded from TDF's Dr. Anne L. Barlow Ramsay Fund for U.S.-Bred Horses. Lauren Chumley with Leeloo Dallas (bred by Rachael McKinney) and Molly O'Brien with Fortunato H2O (bred by Kendra Hansis of Runningwater Warmbloods) were named as recipients.

We recently caught up with Lauren, who has had a productive—and fun!— winter training in Florida with Michael Bragdell to solidify Grand Prix work.

Based in Pittstown, New Jersey, and Loxahatchee, Florida, Lauren is a USDF gold medalist who specializes in young horse development but has also found success in other areas of the equestrian world, including eventing and working with one of the largest Norwegian Fjord breeding farms in the country.

Leeloo Dallas ("Leeloo") is a 2016 Dutch warmblood mare purchased by Lauren as a foal. The filly caught Lauren's eye due to her flashy black color, white socks and nice trot—but she was also rather awkward at that stage, with huge ears, a long, upright neck, and short body. Fortunately, as she matured and developed in her training, the mare came into her own.

Lauren said she was tempted to apply for the grant when Leeloo was a 7-year-old, but things really "lined up" the following year as the mare racked up wins at the regional and national levels. Then the grant, which showcases talented American-bred horses ridden by U.S. citizens, started to feel more within grasp.

As a largely self-funded rider and trainer, Lauren explains that receiving the grant has been "lifechanging," as it has relieved financial pressures and allowed her to focus on bringing her training to the next level.

"We're working on nailing down the elements of the Grand Prix," she said of her current work with Leeloo and Michael. "The horse is so rideable. She has such a good brain. So, for me, it was getting her confident in the piaffe, passage, and onetempis. She's very much a mare and she doesn't want to make a mistake."

Lauren explained that Michael's gentle and patient approach plays a crucial role in their training. "His program and his methodology are so fair to the horses, it's so kind and he wants the horse to understand. That's the focus of it: teaching the horse how to do it and then getting the horse to want to do it for you." With that philosophy in mind, Lauren and Leeloo are aiming to do the Developing Grand Prix late this spring.

Lauren expressed sincere gratitude to TDF and its donors. "Without donors, we wouldn't have these amazing grants and programs that enable normal horse trainers to propel their education with their horses," she explained. "I believe in this little American horse with my whole heart and in Michael's program. I am absolutely thrilled that TDF believes in us too!"





## **Donors Make Dreams Come True**

Thanks to the donors of the Jane Savoie Fund for Adult Amateurs, two \$5,000 grants were awarded in 2024 for the first time!

One of the recipients, Caryn Vesperman (WI), has spent concentrated time in Wellington, Florida, over the past few months training her Tanqueray MRF with Janet Foy and Claudio Oliveira.

Caryn's journey with horses, and her life in general, have been defined by perseverance. "For years, I persevered in my dressage training, attempting to balance a career, family, and my 30-plus years of GMO volunteer work," she explained. "Then I had a health scare." She received a life-changing breast cancer diagnosis, but was determined to continue riding through treatment and side effects.

Her persevering spirit led her to apply for the Jane Savoie Fund grant a few times and, after learning she finally received it, she was speechless. The grant was meaningful for several reasons, not the least of which was Jane's own courageous fight against cancer—a source of inspiration to Caryn.

Now, six years in the clear, Caryn maintains her commitment to volunteering and learning, and was recently accepted into the USEF/USDF "R" judge's program.

Caryn has also persevered in finding creative ways to move toward her goals even amid financial constraints. While in Florida, she scribes at Global Dressage Festival, dog-sits for friends, and resides in the living quarters of her horse trailer. She is grateful for the financial assistance from TDF to continue her growth as a rider.

Thanks to this unique opportunity, Caryn reported that the more refined elements of training are coming together. "Tanqueray is stronger and more balanced, so he's really becoming a 'change machine.' Fours, threes, and twos are now quite reliable," she said, describing her lessons with Janet. While working with Claudio, the pair also continues to build strength in collected work, focusing on half steps, piaffe, and passage—both in long lines and with Caryn in the saddle.



"Even small donations to TDF make a difference. I grew up in Minnesota and I've walked across the headwaters of the Mississippi. It's a trickling little stream about 25 feet wide, but thanks to all the tributaries donating their water to the Mississippi, look what it becomes by the time it hits the Gulf of Mexico. At one point, it's 11 miles wide. That's what all of you TDF supporters are: Tributaries to fulfilling dreams and promoting our wonderful sport of dressage. Together, you provide a powerful river of learning and opportunity."



# A Golden Summer for Lisa Gorretta

If you've been an active member of the dressage community, you've heard Lisa Gorretta's name.

Over the years, she's held many titles: Business owner, 40-year USEF Dressage Technical Delegate, Co-Chair of the Dressage Sport Horse Committee, Past President of the United States Dressage Federation, recipient of the USDF Lifetime Achievement Award, and FEI Dressage Steward.

But, in 2024, at age 70, she and her 31-year-old Swedish Warmblood, Indy, added a new feather to her cap: TDF Century Club member. Even more impressive is that her Century Club ride with her partner of 26 years came on the heels of her trip to France, where she served as a steward at the 2024 Paris Olympic Games.

"The journey to that centerline was not the one that I had thought about as we both advanced in age toward that magic number. I had, frankly, abandoned the plan," Lisa said, explaining that health challenges, such as a stifle injury and cataracts, arose in Indy's older age. In fact, just before Lisa was set to leave to be a steward at the Olympics in Paris, she received a call that Indy had contracted cellulitis in an upper foreleg.

Fortunately, Indy's care team back home was able to help him recover while Lisa was away. After she returned from Paris, she spoke with Indy's vet about starting light lunging to promote mobility in his affected knee. They opted to put Indy back in under saddle work, which was safer than lunging due to his rambunctious spirit. "From Training Level through Prix St. Georges and my USDF silver medal, Indy always had a somewhat unpredictable 'joy-of-life' streak that kept things interesting and improved my seat!" Lisa said.

Thanks to the encouragement of her friend and longtime U.S. dressage supporter Betsy Juliano, Lisa set her sights on the Century Club ride.

"USDF Region 2 Director and USEF S judge Debby Savage kindly accepted our invitation to judge our ride," Lisa explained. "A perfect Ohio fall weather day was made even more so by one last centerline, a square halt, and the final salute."
